On March 9th, the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA), lead agency for the L.A. Continuum of Care announced that HUD Homeless Housing and Services funding awards will provide \$82,986,824 to support 180 renewal projects in the City and County of Los Angeles, providing 9,347 units and beds. The award also includes a planning grant of \$1.25 million, which represents a significant win for Los Angeles.
